Tuesday, March 13th, is Candidate Filing Day for the 2018 Primary Election.

- The Lincoln County Clerk is the proper filing officer for candidates filing for County Offices and Magistrate Judge positions in Lincoln County.
- Candidates may file their Declaration of Candidacy at the Lincoln County Clerk's Office 300 Central Ave Carrizozo, NM 88301
- Beginning at 9 AM to 5 PM on March 13, 2018. Drawing for ballot position will be shortly after 5:00 PM.

As a reminder there are three major parties recognized for the 2018 Primary: Democrat, Republican, and Libertarian. To run as a member of a major party the candidates voter registration must show affiliation with that party on the date of the governor's proclamation for the Primary Election and reside within the proper district.

County Commissioner District 5;

County Clerk;

County Treasurer

Magistrate Judges Divisions I and II.

ALSO as a reminder in 2016 New Mexico State Statute 1-4-2 was amended to allow 17 year olds who will be 18 by the date of the General Election (November 6, 2018) to register prior to books closing for the Primary Election (May 8, 2018) and vote in the Primary! So if you are 17 and will be 18 by November 6th, you can register and vote in the Primary in June!!!

Interested applicants should call the Workforce office at 575-258-1730 as soon as possible to complete the application process and secure a place in the initial training, which will take place in late April.





AA Studios presents "Chaos to Peace" by Las Cruces Painter Kathleen Deasy. AA Studios is located behind 2645 Dona Ana Road on Calle de Oro and is the studio of painter Roy van der Aa. The show will run through April 8th and is open by appointment (call 1-575-520-8752).

Kathleen Deasy presents her series of paintings Chaos to Peace, Seekers and Wanderers. Chaos to Peace are 12 canvases 10x10'' each, representing a journey from Chaos to Peace. We all face times of Chaos in our lives as individuals or as a society as a whole. This series represents the Chaos occurring and the hope for Peace afterwards. The Wanderers and the Seekers are sculpted figures on canvas in oils and acrylics. They depict figures searching for their place as they travel alone and in pairs. They represent Nomads who just keep moving through whatever comes in their path.

Deasy's work will be joined by pieces by gallery owner Roy van der Aa. "As we spoke about the work," says van der Aa, "it was clear they would be amplified by paintings I had done during the second Iraq war." These artworks are dark, sardonic and somewhat subversive, and the art will be hung in a cycle going from dark to light. The artists will lay out a metaphoric journey hoping that each of us can recognize our place on that journey. Deasy and van der Aa also open their studios as part of the "Colorful Trails" second Saturday art tour with Penny Duncklee, Leslie Toombs and Sonya

There will be a **school outreach performance on Monday, April 9th, at 10 AM** at the Carrizozo Old Gym. This event is sponsored by Zia Natural Gas Company and the R.D. and Joan Dale Hubbard Foundation.

Lone Piñon is an acoustic conjunto from Northern New Mexico whose music celebrates the diversity of their region's cultural roots. Using violins, accordion, quinta huapangera, bajo sexto, guitarrón, tololoche and vocals in Spanish, English, Nahuatl, and P'urépecha the group has revived and updated the Chicano stringband style that once flourished in New Mexico, bringing a devoted musicianship to Northern New Mexican polkas and chotes, virtuosic Mexican huapango and son calentano, and classic borderlands conjunto.

New Mexico has long been a crossroads of cultures, and its musical landscape reflects its history of diversity. Lone Piñon is part of a new generation of musicians who embrace the full scope of that complexity. Onstage, they cluster around a single microphone and play with a contagious energy, tying together several dozens of dance forms that resonate in their home state. The result is a new sound, rooted in respect for the past and undeniably alive. Having studied and played professionally a variety of styles, Noah Martinez and Jordan Wax brought their experience together in 2013 in an effort to learn the old repertoire of polkas, *valses*, *varsovianas*, *cunas*, *inditas*, and *chotizes* that have been played for generations in dances in Northern New Mexico.

To reach the Woman's Club from Route 54, turn west at 12th Street between the 54 Emporium and Roy's Ice Cream Parlor. Turn right onto D Ave and drive one block to the historic WPA building on the corner of 11th Street and D Avenue.

Lincoln County Bird Club (LDBC) announces its May field trip to Rattlesnake Springs near Carlsbad on May 2-3. Rattlesnake Springs is a designated New Mexico Important Bird Area site. According to the Audubon.org website, the area serves as a Spring migrant trap attracting several birds and some out-of-range species. Early May is considered the optimum time to observe birds.
